


Medical Supplies

Shipments are starting to come into the CRDP from North Carolina Emergency Management. This week we have received more surgical masks. A large majority of these masks have been distributed to the Local Licensed Care facilities as that are now required by the most recent Governors Executive Order to start wearing masks. We are currently trying to acquire more test kits from private vendors but have not had any luck, orders that have been placed but have a shipment are not scheduled for 6-12 weeks.

 <p>Health and Medical</p>	<p><u>CURRENT IMPACTS</u> <i>TESTING SITE TASK FORCE:</i> No change <i>ADULT/CHILD PROTE. SERVICES:</i> No change <i>NUTRITIONAL COORDINATION:</i> In terms of agency impact, nutrition coordinator staff time has been divided between coordinating food security/nutrition and sheltering for the unsheltered. For the latter issue, significant time has been spent coordinating with multiple community partners, identifying possible shelter options, clarifying the County's role, and researching and writing grants. In the community, the group of 30+ unsheltered residents have been exposed to low temperatures, rainstorms and have to share the same hygiene facilities but are now receiving hot meals thanks to additional efforts by Open Door. Food assistance demand continues to increase with agencies (e.g. Community Kitchen, Haywood Christian Ministry) reporting at least twice as many clients as they served two weeks ago. <i>SCHOOL TASK FORCE:</i> No change <i>PUBLIC HEALTH EDUCATION TASK FORCE:</i> No change <i>HUMAN SERVICES GROUP (GENERAL):</i> No change <i>PUBLIC HEALTH GROUP (General):</i> 4th positive case of COVID 19.</p>

SERVICES:</i> No update <i>NUTRITIONAL COORDINATION:</i> Re: food security: We coordinated with the VOAD task force and community partners to arrange an order of 6 pallets of MREs or similar amount of perishable/non-perishable goods. We shared grant opportunities with additional partners. Our</p>

weekly food security conference call is this afternoon 4/15 and we have requested that agencies share their projections for the coming weeks.

With regards to unsheltered housing, we have coordinated with community and county partners on two potential housing options, written one grant and identified another to support hotel costs for the unsheltered.

SCHOOL TASK FORCE: A plan has been put into place for graduating high school seniors, and awaiting State guidance for underclassmen.

PUBLIC HEALTH EDUCATION TASK FORCE: Positive messaging campaign continues to highlight local heroes and is seeking new individuals to feature.

HUMAN SERVICES GROUP (GENERAL): No change

PUBLIC HEALTH GROUP (General): Begin case investigation and contact tracing of the 4th positive case today. Testing will be offered to contacts of positive cases. On 04-13, the Field Response Task Force leader met with 3 PHNs to review the contact tracing process. Initiating pre-strategic planning for the new normal, may be in planning for daily operations if mitigation requirements are lessened. The Health Director will reach out to Dogwood Health Trust to discuss the possibility of increasing our county's capability to test. MAHEC can be a resource in the event that we need help with contact tracing. Continuing outreach to long-term care facilities/congregate living facilities.

LIMITING FACTORS

ADULT/CHILD PROT. SERVICES: No change

NUTRITIONAL COORDINATION: There is no contract with the willing hotel owner to begin housing the already identified, potential vulnerable identified by community partners, unsheltered residents. The first small round of grant funds is expected later this week. There is a lack of clarity about food supply projections given an unknown number of clients and unknown duration of this event.

<u>Town of Clyde</u>	Clyde Town Hall remains closed to the public. All employees continue to report to work. All town meetings cancelled for the month of April. Park pavilions and playgrounds are closed
<u>Town of Waynesville</u>	The Town of Waynesville is still adhering to scheduling adjustments and closures. The Mulch Sale begins this week and will observe all social distancing guidelines.
<u>Town of Canton</u>	We are moving to an abbreviated schedule for the semi-essential employees beginning tomorrow throughout the two week pay period. Will reevaluate then. Essentials are still working but separated. Non-essentials have been relieved of their duties currently on, in the case of a major issue. Part-Time employees have been placed on temporary lay-off until I decide otherwise.
<u>Town of Maggie Valley</u>	The amount of people arriving daily continues to increase. The follow-ups are a huge part of the Police Departments daily activities to make sure we know who these people are, and get them registered with the Health Dept. Town of Maggie Valley deployed 10 (2x3) temporary signs that convey the "Stay at Home" message in our Second Home and Vacation Rental neighborhoods.

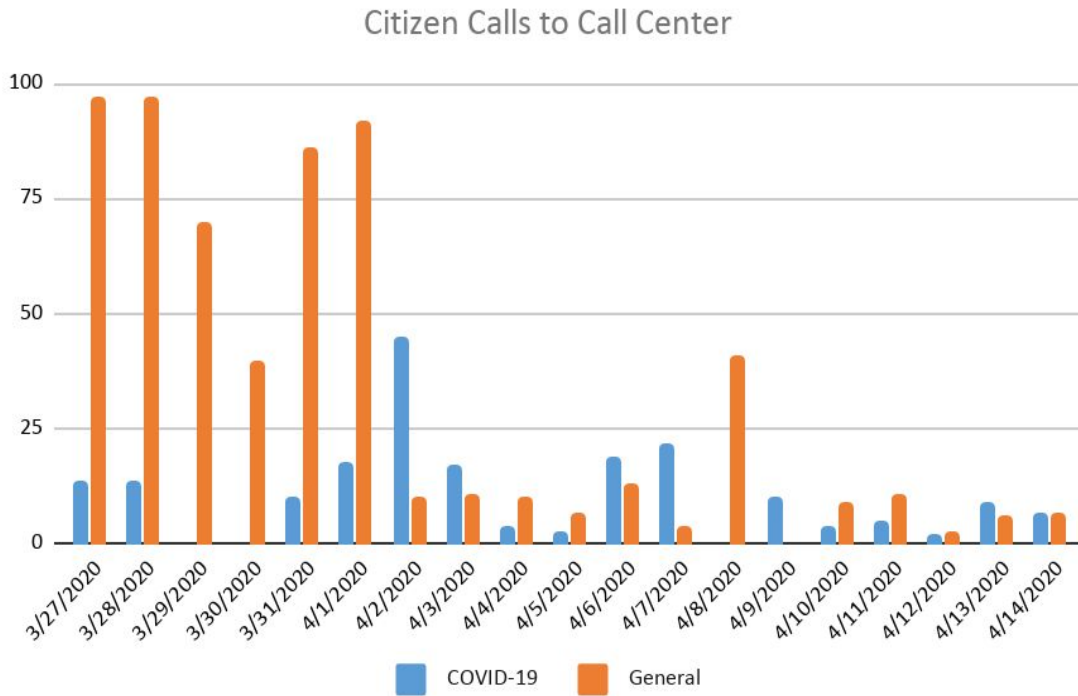

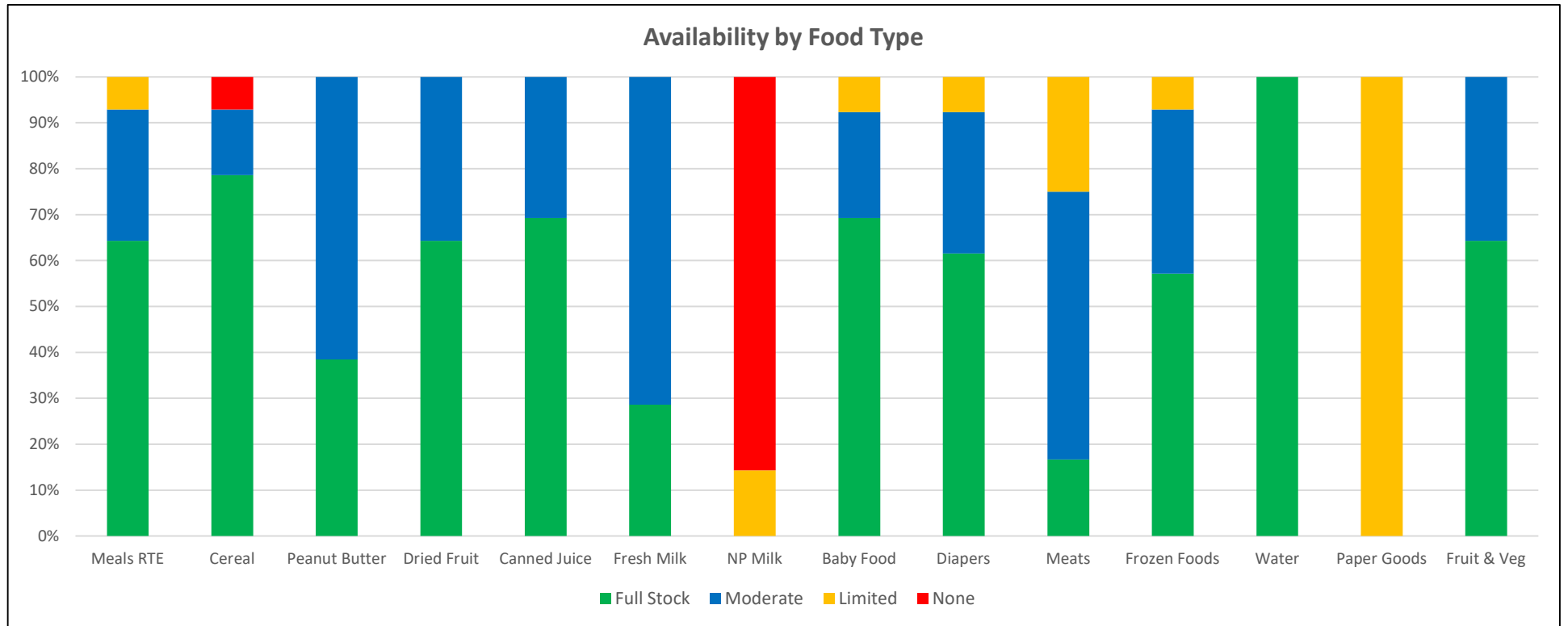
Social Isolation Task Force- no report
